A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE BRIGITTINE / CARMELITE ROSARY

"The Brigittine Rosary was instituted and propagated by St. Bridget of Sweden. The six-decade rosary, or Brigittine beads, is traditional in the Discalced Carmelite Order as part of the habit. The reason for its adoption is found in the explanation of these beads." (*Carmelite Devotions and Prayers for Special Feasts of The Liturgical Year*, Compiled by a Carmelite Tertiary [Published by: Discalced Carmelite Nuns, Wisconsin]).

"The Brigittine beads number seven *Paters* in honor of the sorrows and joys of the Blessed Virgin, and sixty-three *Aves* to commemorate the years of her life." (Fr. Kevin, O.C.D., *Way of Perfection for the Laity* [Dublin: M. J. Gill & Son]).

"Besides the introductory "Our Father" and three "Hail Mary's" there are six mysteries or decades in each of the parts or divisions. In the six Joyful Mysteries the first mystery is The Immaculate Conception, the sixth of the Sorrowful Mysteries is Jesus Taken Down from the Cross and Placed in the Arms of His Mother, the sixth of the Glorious Mysteries is The Patronage of Mary, Queen and Beauty of Carmel.

INDULGENCES

"The Brigittine Rosary was richly indulgenced by Pope Leo X in 1515, by Clement XI in 1716, and by Benedict XIV in 1743." (*Carmelite Devotions and Prayers for Special Feasts of The Liturgical Year*, Compiled by a Carmelite Tertiary [Published by: Discalced Carmelite Nuns, Wisconsin]).

*N.B.--***The indulgences may all be gained by saying five out of the six decades** (Bridgettine Nuns, Syon Abbey, Marley, S. Brent, Devon, England).

The following is taken from a presentation by the Institute of Carmelite Studies (ICS):

"Traditionally, in the Brigittine Rosary, the Apostles's Creed was recited at the end of each decade in place of the Glory be. Also, originally there were no mysteries connected to the Brigittine Rosary. Instead, it was meant to be a meditation on the whole life of the Virgin Mary. Today, Carmelites often pray the sixdecade Rosary in the same way as the five-decade Rosary, just adding a sixth decade along with the corresponding mystery."




In the name of the Father, + and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
